# FEMA App

**Purpose:** Educates individuals and families on effective emergency preparedness practices across various disaster scenarios.



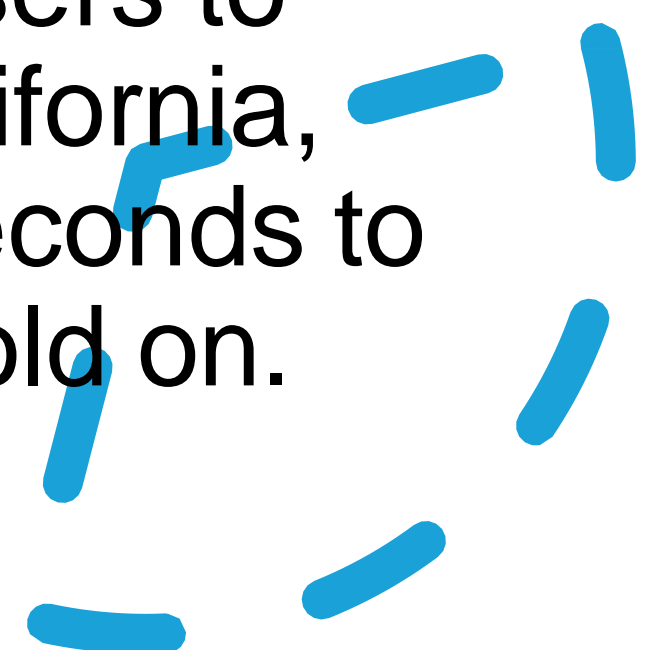




# MyShake App

**Description:** An earthquake alert app that uses smartphone sensors to detect seismic activity and provide early warning alerts.

# NOAA Weather Radar & Alerts

**Description:** Provides real-time weather radar and alerts for severe weather conditions, including wildfire smoke advisories and flash flood warnings.

# AlertCA (formerly Wireless Emergency Alerts -

# Nextdoor App

# Zello App

**Description:** A push-to-talk app that allows real-time voice communication, functioning similarly to a walkie-talkie, even in areas with limited connectivity.

# Citizen App

**Description:** Provides real-time alerts based on nearby incidents, including fires, accidents, and other safety concerns. Allows users to share updates within the app.

**Purpose:** Keeps users informed of safety-related incidents in their vicinity, enhancing personal awareness and safety.

# GroupMe App

**Description:** A group messaging app that simplifies communication with multiple people, useful for neighborhood or family emergency updates.

# PulsePoint Respond

**Description:** Sends notifications to nearby individuals trained in CPR during cardiac emergencies and shows AED locations.

**Purpose:** Assists in saving lives during emergencies by mobilizing trained bystanders quickly.



# Be My Eyes App

**Description:** Connects visually impaired individuals with volunteers or professionals for assistance via video, especially useful during emergencies.

**Purpose:** Provides visual assistance to those in need, helping them navigate challenges during and after an emergency.







# ICE Medical Standard

**Description:** Stores medical information and emergency contacts that first responders can access in case of an emergency.

**Purpose:** Ensures first responders have quick access to critical medical information, aiding in prompt and accurate care.

**Description:** An app with customizable visual aids designed to help individuals with communication and learning difficulties.

**Purpose:** Assists individuals with disabilities in communicating needs during emergencies with pictorial aids.

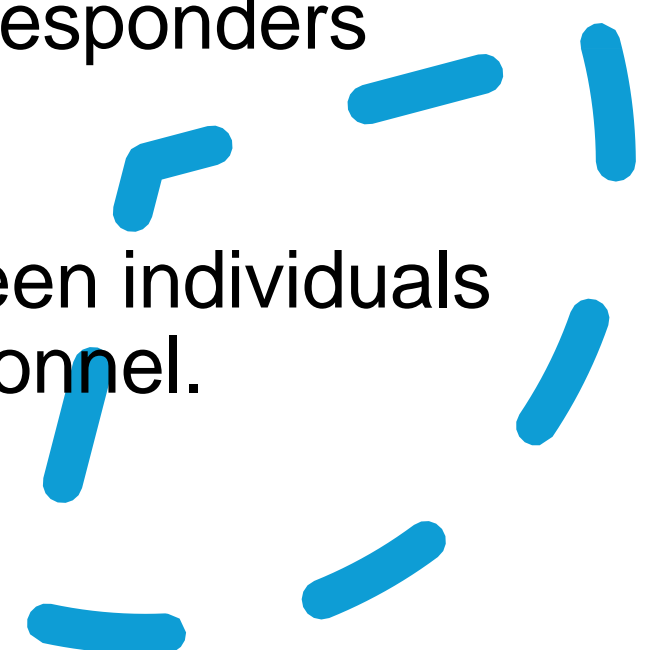




# Show Me for Emergencies App
